# Escape. Connect. Relate. Relationships - Family

Families can, but don't always, live in the same house, share the same surname, or share genetic relationships. Family members can feel a need to provide emotional, physical, and financial stability to other family members. Families can take many forms, including but not limited to: adoption, single parents, foster care (including care-experienced children), break-up (including divorce and separation), step and blended families. Young carers, often from an early age, need to take on regular or ongoing care for another family member, assuming a level of responsibility that would normally only be asked of an adult.

Emotional connections formed in families can often bring happiness, security, and support, but can also be confusing and stressful. Support and resources are available to help.

What Jack doesn't know, is how desperate Joseph is to find his baby girl. Or how urgently he, Jack, will want to help. But the past can't be shaken off. Even as new bonds form, old wounds reopen.
