Substance Misuse & Addiction

Substance misuse refers to the use of any substance (such as alcohol or drugs) that is harmful or hazardous to health. There can be long and short term consequences to even minimal substance misuse. Addiction is defined as not having control over using substances to the point where they are harmful to you, and can affect not only your health, but also your relationships and wider life.

Told from multiple viewpoints, Junk is a powerful, unflinching novel about heroin. Once you take a hit, you will never be the same again.

It's a dirty business getting clean...



Neena's brother disappeared 10 months ago and her parents are broken with grief. Neena is desperate to get to art college, but above all else, she wants to find out exactly what happened to her brother.
